

The Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) at St. Ambrose University is 36 months in length. Successful completion of the program requires student must maintain a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in OTD professional program coursework. OTD coursework is calculated each semester to monitor academic standing. Graduates will complete a total of 97-102 credits, including 24 weeks of full-time fieldwork, and a 14-week Doctoral Capstone Experience.

OVERVIEW

Students begin their coursework learning the Professional Foundation. This includes the domain and process of occupational therapy and the science of the human body that support occupational performance. Students advance to applying their knowledge during classroom and laboratory experiences.

The following semesters emphasize Occupational Engagement: A Fit between Person and Environment. These include courses that examine the client and environmental factors that impact occupational participation, including evidence that guides assessment and intervention strategies that promote occupational engagement considering typical development, as well as the impact of disease, injury, or illness.

Students engage in Fieldwork that allows application and practice of principles from the classroom followed by guided reflection activities.

The final year culminates in a transition from student to practitioner with a doctoral capstone project, comprehensive exam, and capstone experience. This supports the Bridge to Professional Practice.

FORMAT

The OTD Program is delivered in a hybrid model with classes online and on-campus. Students are required to have access to technology/device with Microsoft Office software and access to internet connection. A device is a computer or tablet with a full operating system. The computer or tablet uses a Mac, Windows, or iPad operating system. Any current iPad must be compatible with Microsoft Surface Pro 4 or newer Surface Pro devices running Windows 10 and 11 will be compatible. University owned laptops may be available for testing in emergency situations. However, it is the responsibility of the student to have a device that will allow for class and testing activities.
